The Village with the Big Heart is gearing up for its 3rd annual Copper Kettle Classics August 29th, when more than 100 Classic Cars and Trucks will pack the historic Mill Street one of the province's most beautiful villages and downtown business cores. "It's the closest thing to a Concourse d'Elegance around here," said Corey Finkelstein, chief organizer of the event. "It's an amazing collection of cars and trucks from the area."

The Copper Kettle Classics is a main attraction for the Copper Kettle Festival but besides viewing the Classics, including a large collection of Model As, along the picturesque historic main street; spectators will be delighted that the Copper Kettle Festival is the same day. Some of the festivities include farmers market, artists' gallery, live music, beer garden, kids' corner, and other events that were popular in those bygone years.

Several bands will be performing at the park located at the end of the main street, where many Festival activities will be happening, leaving the entire business section for vintage automobiles. As car aficionados and shoppers admire the classics from the turn of the century to the 1980s, "Hot Pants" a grass roots local favourite rock-a-billy band, will be playing live to get people even more revved up. Even when they're not playing 50's and 60's music will be screeching out from a sound system and heard along the main drag.

"The car show just gets better and better every year," said Alex Hargrave, a car enthusiastic who has been to the last two shows. "It's such a great idea to bring the show together with the festival. It's a day for everyone the children, teens, and adults, anyone who loves just a great day. Besides who doesn't like to reminisce about the car they drove back in the 50's, 60's and 70's? All the great ones are there, coups, Mustangs, Chevys, they're all there."

As well, the Masonic Lodge and Cardboard Castles are sponsoring a MasoniCHip identification program for children in the downtown core. It's a free cost for the parents.
